As a result of the Protestant Reformation there no public statues of the saints or representations of the Crucifixion, and yet we have no problem about the countless statues of Robert Burns & other figures all over Scotland. (However, the new municipal statute of St Michael in Linlithgow bucks the trend). For Catholics, statues, like icons, are windows into heaven; they are not primarily works of art or reminders of history, but devotional objects, designed to help us pray. So, if a statue in a church is destroyed or removed it's not simply vandalism but an attack on religious faith. Interestingly, Protestant churches belatedly now have three-dimensional nativity scenes at Christmas. So, we treat them with respect. Religious statues are essentially three-dimensional portraits of our Lord Jesus, Holy Mary, angels, and the saints. They are the embodiment of the presence of the holy and the Divine in our lives. A Catholic home without a depiction of the Crucifixion and Our Lady would be a sad Catholic home. They also serve as an outward symbol of our faith and commitment to Christianity. "We should honour God in His saints and beseech Him to make us partakers of the graces He poured so abundantly upon them." — St. Vincent de Paul
